INGREDIENTS

- 2 lbs ground beef
- 1 onion diced
- 4 cloves garlic minced
- 2 jalapeños and 1 serrano minced
- 1 poblano, 1 Anaheim pepper peeled, roasted and diced
- 1/4 cup chili powder
- 2 tbsp dried oregano
- 1 tbsp ground cumin
- 29 oz can diced tomato, drained
- 1 1/2 cup beef stock
- 15 oz can pinto beans, drained and rinsed

Topping

- 1 cup sour cream
- 1/4 cup cilantro chopped
- 1/2 tbsp chili powder
- 1/2 tsp cayenne pepper
- 3/4 cup grated Colby cheese

INGREDIENTS

- (6) All beef hot dogs
- (6) Thinly sliced smoked bacon strips
- (6) Hot dog buns

Pinto bean puree

- 15 oz can of pinto beans drained and rinsed
- 1/4 cup chicken stock
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1/8 tsp cayenne and dried oregano
- Salsa Fresca

Jalapeño mayo

- 10 jalapeños stemmed and seeded
- 1 onion minced
- 2 cloves garlic minced
- 2 tbsp lime juice
- 5 cups mayo

RECIPE 1 5 ALARM CHILI

- Brown beef in large skillet, drain. Add onion and garlic, sauté on medium heat for 5 minutes.
- Use a slotted spoon to scoop the beef into a large crockpot. Combine all ingredients in the crockpot (not topping). Stir to mix well.
- Cook on low for 4 hours or on high for 2 hours. (If you cook on high, stir every 30 minutes).
- In a separate bowl combine all topping ingredients and stir well. Refrigerate until ready to serve.
- Once chili is ready, add your toppings and sprinkle with Colby Cheese.

RECIPE 2 SONORAN DOG

- Make sure hot dog bun is cut. If the buns are doughy, make a pocket in each by pulling tufts of dough out of the center. Toast the buns slightly or steam them.
- Take end of the slice of bacon and wrap around the hot dog like a stripe on a candy cane. Repeat with remaining slices and hot dogs.
- Arrange the bacon-wrapped hot dogs in a small skillet. Cook the hot dogs over medium heat until the bacon is crisp and fused to the dogs. Carefully turn all over at once to cook the other side until bacon is brown.
- Place hot dog in a bun, add bean puree and salsa Fresca. Using squirt bottle, if possible, pipe thin lines of jalapeño mayo across the dog followed by mustard. Repeat with remaining buns and hot dogs.

Pinto Bean Puree

- Combine all ingredients in blender. Puree and set aside.

Jalapeño Mayo

- Place onion in a heavy bottom pot over high heat. Cook 5 minutes until slightly charred, stirring often. Add garlic and cook for 30 seconds, making sure the garlic doesn't burn. Remove from skillet and set aside.
- Add 2 tbsp of olive oil and jalapeños to the hot skillet and cook until jalapeños are slightly charred, add lime juice, remaining 2 tbsp of olive oil and salt. Cook 1-2 minutes, until jalapeños are softened.
- Transfer jalapeño mixture, onions, and garlic to a blender and puree until smooth. When cool, stir in 5 cups of mayo. If applying mayo with squirt bottle, add more lime juice and water to thin.

JUSTIN WELLS

"With stunning insight and honesty, Justin Wells speaks upon the disillusion of dreams, the realization of new ones, the reality of the pitfalls of the rock and roll fantasy, and does so with cutting clarity and poetic facility." - Saving Country Music

A roots-rock songwriter with a rough-and-tumble rasp of a voice, Justin Wells' music shines a light on the highs and lows of a life spent on the road. For years, the Kentuckian shared that road with his bandmates in Fifth on the Floor. The guys were southern rock underdogs, and they climbed their way toward success on their own terms, earning a cult following and a Billboard chart placement for their album *Ashes & Angels* along the way. Their songs drifted back and forth across the line between brash and broken, carried by loud guitars and louder sentiment. However, the band abruptly parted ways in early 2015.



The dismantling of the band fueled the writing on Wells' first solo record, the critically-acclaimed *Dawn in the Distance*. On it, his voice is still mountain-sized, while looking beyond the Southern stomp of his former band. Produced by Duane Lundy (Ringo Starr, Sturgill Simpson's Sunday Valley, Joe Pug), the album is Wells' most affecting to date. Songs like "The Dogs" and "The Highway Less Taken" catch the singer staring in the mirror, while "Going Down Grinnin" and "Still No Rain" move like a drifter, unwilling to quit.

KENTUCKY FACTS AND TRIVIA

- The Kentucky Derby is the oldest continuously held horse race in the country. It is held at Churchill Downs in Louisville on the first Saturday in May.
- The Bluegrass Country around Lexington is home to some of the world's finest racehorses.
- Cheesburgers were first served in 1934 at Kaolin's restaurant in Louisville.
- Mammoth Cave is the world's longest cave and was first promoted in 1816, making it the second oldest tourist attraction in the United States. Niagara Falls, New York is first.
- Begun in 1819, the first commercial oil well was on the Cumberland River in McCreary County.
- The first Kentucky Fried Chicken restaurant, which was owned and operated by Colonel Sanders, is in Corbin.
- Kentucky is the state where both Abraham Lincoln, President of the Union, and Jefferson Davis, President of the Confederacy, were born. They were born less than one hundred miles and one year apart.
- Cumberland is the only waterfall in the world to regularly display a Moonbow. It is located just southwest of Corbin.
- Fleming County is recognized as the Covered Bridge Capital of Kentucky.
- Shelby County is recognized as the Saddlebred Capital of Kentucky.
- Christian County is wet while Bourbon County is dry. Barren County has the most fertile land in the state.
- Thunder Over Louisville is the opening ceremony for the Kentucky Derby Festival and is the world's largest fireworks display.
- More than 100 native Kentuckians have been elected governors of other states.
- The song "Happy Birthday to You" was the creation of two Louisville sisters in 1893.
- The great Man o' War won all of his horse races except one, in which he lost to a horse named Upset.
- The first town in the United States to be named for the first president was Washington. It was named in 1780.
- The first American performance of a Beethoven symphony was in Lexington in 1817.
- Post-It Notes are manufactured exclusively in Cynthiana. The exact number made annually of these popular notes is a trade secret.
- Bluegrass is not really blue--it's green--but in the spring bluegrass produces bluish purple buds that when seen in large fields give a blue cast to the grass. Today Kentucky is known as the Bluegrass State.
- Daniel Boone and his wife Rebecca are buried in the Frankfort Cemetery. Their son Isaac is buried at Blue Licks Battlefield near Carlisle, where he was killed in the last battle of the Revolutionary War fought in Kentucky.
- The public saw an electric light for the first time in Louisville. Thomas Edison introduced his incandescent light bulb to crowds at the Southern Exposition in 1883.
- The radio was invented by a Kentuckian named Nathan B. Stubblefield of Murray in 1892. It was three years before Marconi made his claim to the invention.
- The first enamel bathtub was made in Louisville in 1856.
- In the War of 1812 more than half of all Americans killed in action were Kentuckians.
- Middlesboro is the only city in the United States built within a meteor crater.
- High Bridge located near Nicholasville is the highest railroad bridge over navigable water in the United States.



HEMP USES

Hemp uses is known to be cultivated specifically for industrial purposes in years gone. In fact, it was used in China and the Middle East back in 8000 BC. HUMAN FOOD

Hemp uses include human food. You can use it in quite a few recipes. Because of its health benefits, humans can consume it. You can make salad oil using hemp. Hemp seeds are eaten in the same way you eat regular nuts. You can add hemp seeds to your cake batter to produce baked goods. Hemp is high in essential fatty acids and amino acids. These are important to your diet. You can crush the hemp seed and make oil or flour.

PET FOOD AND BEDDING

The hemp plant can be used in pet food since it has so many healthy proteins. When given to cats, it makes their coats shiny and healthy. It can also be used as a dietary supplement for nourishing dogs, cows and horses. Hemp seeds are also enjoyed by birds. Hemp uses also include pet bedding for animals such as guinea pigs, rats and other rodents. It is good to use in cat litter.

BODY OIL AND LOTIONS

The hemp plant is known for containing oils used in body lotions and essential oils. It has an EFA content, which aids in the regeneration of cracked and dry skin. It is an amazing moisturizer.

OIL BASED PRODUCTS


Hemp uses include oil for candles, lanterns and paint. The oil from hemp is used to make any oil-based products. Paint is one of them. In fact, when used to make paint, you will find that the paint job last much longer. Hemp oil is non-toxic and not harmful to the environment.

CLOTHING

Hemp is used to manufacture clothing such as jeans and sport clothing, lingerie and other high fashion apparel. Hemp uses makes clothing last longer. Some of the celebrity clothing labels that use hemp fibers are Ralph Lauren, Armani and Calvin Klein.

PLASTIC

Plastic products made from hemp are usually biodegradable and can aid in reducing landfills.



PAPER

Paper is sometimes made using hemp. It is more economical to use hemp to make paper. It saves the trees and protects the wildlife and forests. This is a nice way to protect the environment.

CONSTRUCTION

MATERIALS

Hemp plant can make strong and durable materials for construction. For example, cement made from hemp uses minerals and core fibers. When hemp is used to make homes, there is stronger resistance to bad weather and less damage incurred during bad weather.



FUEL

Hemp uses includes making fuel such as bio-diesel. The petroleum industry has embraced the use of hemp in making its products. Ethanol production is also popular in the hemp industry.



Pretty Boy: More Than a Racehorse

I met Colonel Tracy Lucas at Red Mile Gaming & Racing in the summer of 2017. During our first conversation, I knew that he and I would be friends for a very long time.

Colonel Lucas has passion and a warm heart. He cares.

Colonel Lucas and members of the Lexington, Kentucky, American Legion Man O'War Post 8 founded the Camp Nelson Honor Guard over 20 years ago. Camp Nelson Honor Guard is the Resident Guard of Camp Nelson National Cemetery, which is in the rolling hills of Jessamine County, Kentucky just south of Lexington.

It's one of only three honor guards in the nation that perform full and enhanced military honors using the caisson and riderless horse. It's the only honor guard that provides the single horse hearse for all military active duty personnel and veterans.

On a cool night in March, I interviewed Colonel Lucas about "Pretty Boy: More than a Race Horse."

David Hadland: *What was your first thought when you saw "Pretty Boy"?*

Colonel Lucas: He dazzled me. He had his own personality. His name was Dazzling Fashion when I first saw him at the Red Mile in 1998. "Pretty Boy" came later.

David Hadland: *What happened at The Red Mile Racetrack?*

Colonel Lucas: Well, we needed a horse to pull the caisson at Camp Nelson. We were striking out everywhere trying to get a horse donated for the cause. I called Bud Davis, who is a standardbred trainer, and a veteran. He said he would help get us a horse. He knew of some owners that may be willing. I got a call from Bud that an owner, Oscar Thornton, was someone we should talk with. I went to the Red Mile and met with Oscar. He said, "If you are willing to give him a purpose in life and take good care of him, you can have him." Bud Davis chimed in and said, "Oscar, I can't think of a better purpose for Dazzling Fashion then to take our active duty service men & women and veterans to their final resting place." That's where the story began.

David Hadland: *How did you come up with "Pretty Boy"?*

Colonel Lucas: A former groom and handler fell in love with him. She called him her "Pretty Boy." From that point forward, that became his name.

David Hadland: Where was he born?

Colonel Lucas: He was foaled on May 2nd, 1998 in Grabill, Indiana. He raced on many tracks as a pacer. He retired from racing in 2007. That's when we him to Camp Nelson Honor Guard Headquarters.

David Hadland: When was his first service to his country?

Colonel Lucas: June 6th, 2008. He was the riderless horse with the boots inverted to show that the commander is giving his troops the final farewell. That commander was Command Sergeant Major Retired John "Jack" Oliver.

David Hadland: How many services did "Pretty Boy" perform for his country?

Colonel Lucas: He performed over a thousand services at Camp Nelson and burial sites throughout Kentucky.

David Hadland: In October of 2017, you laid "Pretty Boy" to rest. Oscar Thornton was there for the funeral. It meant a lot to you that he and his wife came to the service. You said in an earlier article that, "Pretty Boy has always been my go-to guy whenever I was in a scary situation or needed somebody that was calm and was able to handle it, I always came to Pretty Boy, he was always there."

"He was the last sight that the family sees as he comes over the little hill down into the committal shelter. I know in my heart that image is burnt into their minds and their hearts forever."

David Hadland: He was very important to you and the Camp Nelson Honor Guard. What is the future look like for the Camp Nelson Honor Guard?

Colonel Lucas: His name is "Lincoln." He is "Pretty Boy's" successor. I couldn't have found a better horse than Lincoln to replace my old friend.

David Hadland: When do we get to see Lincoln?

Colonel Lucas: You get to see Lincoln at the Red Wagon Festival on Saturday April 13th! Lincoln will be giving carriage rides to the public to support the children of Shriners Hospital. He loves children as much as I do. We are both looking forward to creating a lot of smiles.

David Hadland: Thanks Colonel Lucas to you, Lincoln, the volunteers at Camp Nelson Honor Guard and the spirit of our old friend Pretty Boy.

Colonel Lucas: Thank you and the Red Wagon Festival team for helping our cause. God Bless you all.
